



Peace Ahoy as Johnny Depp and Amber Heard Agree on Divorce Settlement

Captain Jack Sparrow may have been adept at charming his way out of the trickiest situations but Johnny Depp's ship clearly ran aground during the fierce divorce battle he has had with his now ex-wife, actress Amber Heard.

Although they married with great fanfare in 2015, it only took 15 months for the marriage to break down with claims and counter claims, the most serious being Heard's accusations of Depp's violence against her. This was strenuously denied by Depp's attorneys and his ex-partner Vanessa Paradis and their daughter Lily Rose who also stepped in to publicly support the movie star, whose supercool persona and acting talent is alleged to have earned him over \$400million.

According to reports, Amber Heard has received just £5.3million which she is planning to donate to two charities, the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) to prevent violence against women, and half to the Children's Hospital of Los Angeles.

The actress said she hoped to "help those less able to defend themselves" and money had not been her motivating factor.

Despite the explosive nature of their split, they released a bizarre joint statement claiming that their relationship was "intensely passionate and at times volatile, but always bound by love. Neither party has made false accusations for financial gain. There was never any intent of physical or emotional harm."
